Bumper turnout at Tua Marina

On Saturday 16th March the weather gods smiled and 10 pilots plus many models arrived at TuaMarina for some NDC (National Decentralised Competition) soaring – see photo below. Several tasks were flown including 'ALES Radian', 'ALES 200' and 'Thermal H' and the conditions were excellent throughout the morning with light winds and reliable lift and some quite decent scores were achieved. MAMs continues to perform well against other clubs throughout NZ in the NDC soaring rankings.

Lake Station Scale Glider Aerotow - Feb 23-26th

This is the premier event of its type in NZ and we are lucky to have it happening annually right on our doorstep. There were approximately 25 pilots participating this year from as far afield as Waiheke Island to Waimate as well as several local pilots. There were numerous awesome scale models flown during the 4-day event - both towplanes and gliders - and the most impressive by far was a 50% scale 9m ASG 29 flown by its owner Ricky Bruce from Dunedin, ably assisted by Dave Griffin from Christchurch who is an expert RC glider pilot and also happens to fly an Airbus A320 for his day job. Marlborough Aerotow


26th-29th April 2024

The 2024 Marlborough Aerotow will take place from 26th-29th April at Quaildale Station. We have a 500m grass airstrip and airspace up to 2000ft agl. All RC pilots and friends are welcome. Bring a model to fly or just come along to watch the action.

The site will be available from 09.00-17.00 each day. Pilots must be current MFNZ members to fly.

Directions:

From Blenheim take SH6 west for 6km. Before Renwick turn left onto SH63. After 2km, at Grove



Mill Winery, turn left onto Waihopai Valley Road. After 15km cross the iron bridge over the Waihopai River and after approximately 200m turn right onto Quaildale Road. Take the gravel track for approximately 400m then turn left through the 3rd gate on the left opposite the woolshed. Follow the vehicle tracks across the field to the gate at the far corner. Go through the gate and turn left, the airstrip is straight ahead in the gap between the trees. Leave all gates as you find them. NOTE:- Participation fee for the aerotow of \$30 per pilot is payable at the field. Spectating and flying non-aerotow models is

free.

The Soaring Scene

After an interminable period of windy weather we are finally starting to see some good flying days. I'm not saying the weather has been great for soaring, as it's starting to get a bit cool and colder weather normally has two effects, not many thermals and cold hands. None of us like cold hands but most in the glider group will put up with that if there's lift about. Hopefully that situation will improve because it hasn't been great recently.

We have had some good turnouts though - there were 11 cars at the strip a couple of weeks ago, the most we've seen for a long time. One of those belonged to Steve Windsor from North Queensland, who visits for a couple of months each year. Steve is everyone's mate and his annual visit is enjoyed by all as his antics with small scratch built foam models constantly amuse, and often amaze, those of us geared to more conventional aircraft. There was a lot of banter when he first arrived and turned up in a puffer jacket while everyone else was in shorts and tee shirts. He and Sally have hightailed it back to Oz now the weather is getting cooler - this photo was taken the day before they left and it was definitely cool when we first arrived, cool enough to get me in a jacket as well.

We are now well into the NDC season with 3 months of events completed. It did seem that we were struggling to match previous year's scores in January and February but it appears that the adverse weather we were struggling with was common in other places as well. In NDC we put forward our scores each month to the recording officer to be collated and we don't see all the other club's scores until about halfway through the following month, so at this stage we have only January and February available. I'm happy to say that Phil Elvy is the current leader, Rex Ashwell is second and Peter Deacon is fourth, although as a club we are well behind the Christchurch club's total. Plenty of time for those positions to change as this only represents 2 of the 11 months in the season.

Below are scores from the March events. As you can see from the scores, competition is quite intense and the difference in individual scores is frequently just a few seconds or a poor landing. The difference between first and second in ALES 200 is just 19 points after flying four 10 minute flights. To give some perspective a perfect score in this event is 2600 points, which requires landing at **exactly** 10 minutes and within 1 metre of the landing target......four times! The current record is 2597 held by John Shaw of the Christchurch club - that's just 3 seconds dropped, almost unimaginable precision.

We have had plenty of scores in the 2500s over the years and there was one outstanding day in September of 2022 when our final scoresheet read Rex Ashwell 2586, Garry Morgan 2569 and Peter Deacon 2526. We were elated with that result until Christchurch's scores arrived, John Shaw 2589, Dave Griffin 2582 and Anton Nikoloff 2557. A score in the mid 2500s is normally good enough for an overall win, but not that day.
