My long term build project, the F6F Hellcat, is progressing very slowly (photos below).





It is 1/6 scale and about 2.16 metre wingspan. With 50cc engine and retracts fitted it weighs 8.7kg, hopefully after finishing and painting and radio installation it will be about 10-11kg, not too bad for this type of model. Have fun, fly safely. (Carl M)
